<u>School Community</u>. Robbinsdale Cooper High School [RCHS] is a four-year, comprehensive high school located in New Hope, MN, a first tier, northwestern suburb of Minneapolis, Minnesota. RCHS is one of two high schools in the Robbinsdale Area School District and is accredited by the North Central Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools. The two high schools serve all or part of the communities of Robbinsdale, Crystal, New Hope, Plymouth, Golden Valley, Brooklyn Center and Brooklyn Park.

RCHS offers programs to prepare students for technical, two-year and four-year colleges, as well as employment directly after high school. Serving a diverse student population of approximately 1655 students, areas of study include general courses, college preparatory courses, special education courses, International Baccalaureate Middle Years Program, and International Baccalaureate Diploma Program [IB]. Students may also choose to participate in the Post-Secondary Education Options Program [PSEO], attending technical, two-or four-year colleges.

<u>Curriculum.</u> A comprehensive curriculum is available to students. Areas of study include: art, business and marketing education, English and language arts, family and consumer science, global languages, health, mathematics, music, physical education, science, and social studies.

<u>Transcript Information.</u> Information on the transcript is listed by school year. The year earned, course number, class title, grade, and credits earned are listed for each class. Information included is cumulative GPA, class rank, MCA-III scores and ACT scores.

Ranking

A final grade is assigned at the end of the semester for each course. All grades are <u>unweighted</u>. We do not report rank unless requested by the student. All grades are figured into the GPA, except for the P grade, which counts as a credit, but is not figured into the GPA. Honor Rolls are calculated by semester.

Testing

Copies of students' PSAT, ACT, SAT I & II, AP, and IB scores are sent to colleges with the application for admission upon request of the student. The mean ACT scores for the graduating Class of 2021 are: English 15.2, Math 16.7, Reading 17.5, Science 17.8, and Composite 16.9 Average IB score for 2021-22 for all students is 3.98 on 1 – 7 scale.
